### **David Sinned and Was Restored**

August 12, 2018

This week are going to learn about God's unending forgiveness that David experienced and we can too because of Jesus. David sinned against God by taking Bathsheba away from Uriah and having Uriah killed in combat, but when God sent Nathan to confront him about his sin, David repented and God forgave him. David's sin came with a price though, as sin always does.

In the same way, we can receive God's forgiveness too because God sent His Son, Jesus, to pay the price for our sin. Jesus died the death we deserve so that we could be made right with God.

Help your kids understand that sin is serious and that God has not promised to spare us from its consequences. At the same time, point out the love, mercy, and grace of God that we experience because of Jesus and how in Jesus we have been completely forgiven of all our sin.

## David Sinned and Was Restored

2 Samuel 11:1-12:14; Psalm 51

Key Passage: Psalm 47:7

Christ Connection: God forgave David for his sins, but sin always has consequences. When we sin, God forgives us because Jesus faced the consequences for our sins when He died on the cross.

**Big Picture Question and Answer:** Who is our King? Jesus is our King forever.

Main Point for Babies and Toddlers:
Jesus is our King.

Main Point for Preschoolers: God forgave David.

#### **Bible Story Points:**

- · David made a wrong choice.
- David asked God to forgive him, and God forgave

- · God forgives us through His Son, Jesus.



## David Sinned and Was Restored

2 Samuel 11:1-12:14: Psalm 51

Main Point: God forgave David when he repented of his sin.

**Big Picture Question:** Who is our King? Jesus is our King forever, and He rules over the world.

Christ Connection: When David sinned against God, God forgave him, but sin always comes with a price. God spared David's life, but David's son died. When we sin, we can receive God's forgiveness because God sent His Son, Jesus, to pay the price for our sin. Jesus died the death we deserve so that we could be made right with God.

Key Passage: Psalm 47:7-8

# Toddlers Memory Verse

### **Babies & Toddlers:**

Song: Sing to the tune of "God Is So Good":

"Who is our King? Who is our King?

Who is our King? He is Je-e-sus."

Say: God's people wanted a king to lead them, but later God sent Jesus to be our King. Jesus is our King!

### Family Discussion Starters:

- Think about & discuss everyone who was affected by David's sin.
- Tell about a time someone else was affected by a wrong choice you made.
- Have you ever tried to cover up something you did wrong?
- Why is sin still bad even when you don't get caught?
- What ways can sin harm our relationships?
- How can we be sure God will forgive us of our sins?

### Family Activity Ideas:

- Make mini sheep with toothpicks, corks, and cotton balls. Talk to your kids about the story Nathan told David.
- Read Psalm 51:4. Talk about how even when sin affects others, our sin is most of all a sin against God.
- David took something that did not belong to him. Challenge each family member to do the opposite and give away one item that belongs to him or her.
